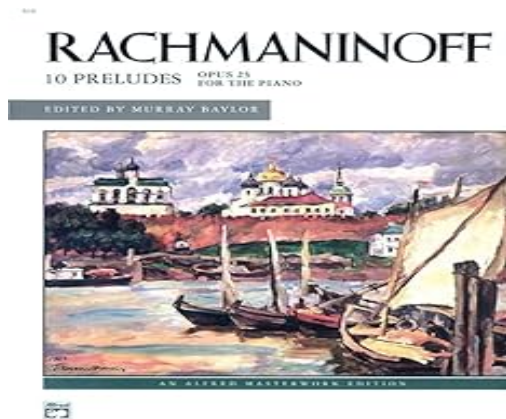


Book Rachmaninoff Preludes, Op. 23 31
