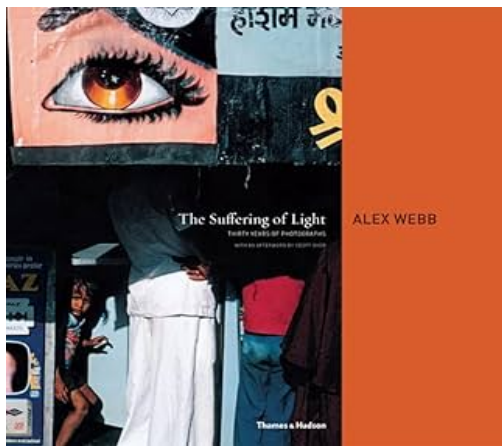

Gathering some of Alex Webbs most iconic images many of which were taken in the far corners of the earth this title brings a fresh perspective to his extensive catalogue. Only issue was it was damaged had a punched mark in the outer cover like a stab wound and the corner of the book was bent showing through all pages quite a thing as it's hard back and robust. First off the hook is HUGE which I just got for my birthday (I requested it as it came up on 's 'recommended' the cover got me interested and as I already had his 'Istanbul' book which I found cheap whilst browsing in a bookshop I got it ordered and eagerly looked forward to seeing whether it lived up to expectations)It did!. I have never enjoyed turning the pages of a photo book so much the anticipation excitement and ensuing smile and simple joy brought at the turn of nearly every page had me mentally jumping for joy and catching my breath at the physical sensuality of the rich colours and intricate almost maze like compositions. He reminds me of and is equal to Steve Mc Curry and William Eggleston for colour is reminiscent of Ray K Metzker and Lee Friedlander for novel and intricate compositions certainly equals HCB for decisive moments and really shows Martin Parr up a treat (eat your heart out Martin!) absolutely great! I have never seen better; in fact never seen as good.
