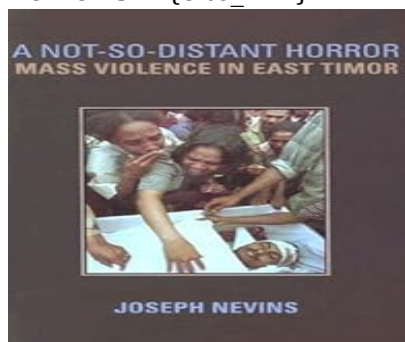


A Not-So-Distant Horror: Mass Violence in East Timor By Joseph Nevins **A Not-So-Distant horrorism** {site_link}
