It's the blatant transphobia homophobia and biphobia for me 148 This book has a really interesting premise and I've apparently been feeling the books in verse lately. **Otherwise adalah** Just as for Spark who becomes attracted to another without knowing their sex roles so the author attempts to hide from readers the gender of Whistler a person who follows Spark home to her parents' house with less than a month before gender identification becomes unlawful. **Otherwise likewise** What even was the point trying to be proven-that gender is important? That getting to decide for yourself what your gender is is important? That none of it matters because /gasp/ the main character fell in love?? On top of that I couldn't tell if I found the whole thing just silly or plain rude. **Wise and otherwise book** But who is Whistler? And what is Whistler? Boy? Or girl? This gender-bending story in verse will make readers question everything they thought they knew about love chemistry and cultural norms. **Wise and otherwise pdf** The varying lengths of the chapters are ideal for a struggling reader giving them breaks to collect their thoughts to imagine the characters in their mind's eye and to set the scene--like a frame in a movie:
