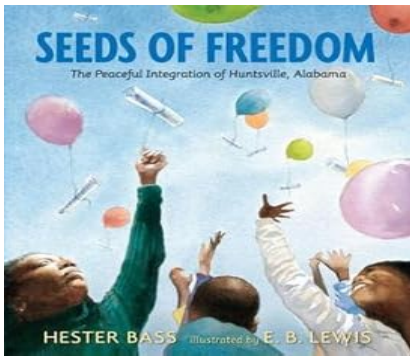

But they were committed to non-violence. They staged sit-ins at restaurants and public parks. But the greatest goal challenge lay ahead. A powerful reminder. Black people were not allowed to try on shoes.Huntsville was home of the space program. The seeds of freedom needed attention to grow.Easter time was a booming sales time for stores. This was known as Blue Jean Sunday. White ministers advocated for and supported Blue Jean Sunday. The people had a different message than that of hate. Thus the mayor advocated for freedom and peace. President Kennedy visited Huntsville to advocate for freedom. Four students went into the white school.I re read this book three times.There was no Bull Connor spewing vile bigotry. E. B. Lewis' illustrations are masterful. This book shines brightly. But it just doesn't feel very compelling. This is a lovely book. Honest hopeful and inspiring. Childrens Books.
