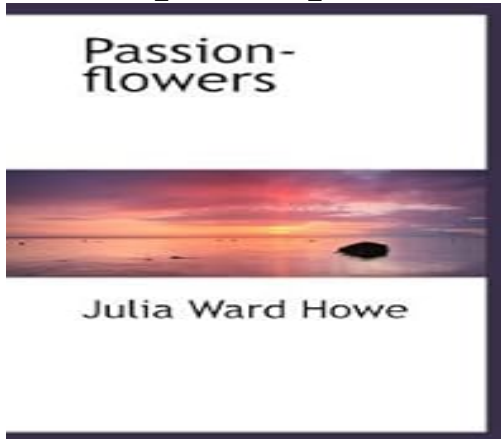


Passion-flowers By Julia Ward Howe
